LIVING JESUS

This is part 3 of a 6-part series examining what it truly means to 'Live Jesus' as taught by St. Francis DeSales.

PREPARING FOR THE DAY

While Francis de Sales was a student at the University of Padua, he established for himself a "Rule of Day" which has become known as his Spiritual Exercises. An underlying assumption in these exercises is that by drawing oneself into God's presence in the midst of ordinary activities, an ordinary task becomes a sacred act. A particular practice in the Spiritual Exercises which enables a person to find God in the ordinary tasks of daily living is the "Preparation of the Day." It is a practice performed daily in the morning, where by using your imagination you try to foresee the places you must go, the situations which you may face, the people with whom you may come into contact, and the things you must do during the course of the day. Francis then advises us to come up with a plan of action to accomplish these tasks. This is an unobtrusive practice that you can do while getting washed, showered, and dressed in the morning. It invites you to foresee the events of the day and consider how to approach them in a way that encourages a recollection of God in all things.

SCRIPTURAL REFERENCES:

- "Yahweh, my God, I call for help all day" (Psalm 88.1).
- "Unload your burden on to Yahweh and He will support you" (Psalm 55.22).
- "I will instruct you and teach you the way to go. I will watch over you and be your advisor" (Psalm 5.3).

SALESIAN SOURCES:

- "We cannot always offer God great things, but at each instant we can offer him little things with great love." Jane de Chantal
- "Before everything else I will always make the exercise of preparation, and I will do it at least once a day in the morning" (Francis de Sales, *Spiritual Exercises*, p. 26).
- "May your whole life and everything you do tend to unite you to God. May your prayers, good works, and practice of virtues, above all that of charity, contribute to the life of the Church and to the salvation of your neighbor. For this reason, may you desire nothing so much as to live an intensely spiritual life. Then, while pleasing God, your power for good will be communicated to the hearts of the faithful" (Joanna Marie Wenzel, *In the Midst of the World*, p.4).

PRACTICING THE LITTLE VIRTUES

In the Salesian tradition, there is a value in doing "little things" amid busy ordinary lives extraordinarily well. Francis de Sales and Jane de Chantal believed that greatness comes to those who are persistent in doing the ordinary, everyday tasks rather than accomplishing great historical achievements. The primary "little virtues" in the Salesian tradition are gentleness and humility. To "Live Jesus" one needs to develop a "gentle heart" which is fashioned from the inside out. To become gentle one needs to be gentle, first of all with oneself, and not to become upset or discouraged by one's failing, but to pick oneself up again and again. It is only when a person can be gentle to self that he or she can reach out and be gentle and compassionate to others. True Salesian humility is the recognition that the human person is essentially "interdependent," needful of God and the assistance of others. When a person can accept the truth of this insight, then he or she is humble.

SCRIPTURAL REFERENCES:

- "Learn from me for I am gentle and humble of heart" (Matthew 11.29).
- "Wrap yourselves in humility and be servants of each other because God refuses the proud and will always favor the humble" (1 Peter 5.5).
- "This is what Yahweh asks of you: only this, to act justly, to love tenderly, and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6.8).

SALESIAN SOURCES:

- "Thus the whole man is taken up with loving God in his heart by joy, peace, patience, forbearance, generosity and faith and in his actions by kindness, gentleness, courtesy, temperateness, and purity" (Francis de Sales, *Treatise on the Love of God*, p. 154).
- "When God gives us His gifts, graces, and talents, he intends us to use them. Not to do so is a proud refusal to cooperate with God. It is true humility to obey and comply as nearly as possible to what He gives us" (Francis de Sales, *Introduction to the Devout Life*, p. 137).
- "The one who preserves gentleness in the midst of sorrows and sufferings, and peace in the midst of multiplicity and busyness of affairs—that person is almost perfect. A second virtue highly prized in Salesian Spirituality is humility. Long an ideal in the classic spirituality of Christendom, humility retained its centrality in the thought of Francis and Jane. Humility expressed for them the recognition of the reality of human dependence upon God, the truth of profound limitations of the individual persons and the acknowledgment of the illusory human pride that strives to be like God and so conspires to its own destruction" (*Letters of Spiritual Direction*, pp. 64-65).


