Pilgrimage to Annecy



This Saturday, 84 Pilgrims from the Oratory, Mount Aviat, and Paul VI School in Virginia began their return from our pilgrimage to Annecy, France. Please keep them in your prayers as they journey safely around Europe and make their way back home.

Our Journey:

Monday: Arrival

Tuesday: Travel to Allinges, St. Francis' home during his missionary work in the Chablais Region. Here we will celebrate mass in the same chapel where St. Francis de Sales celebrated mass each day, then tour the town of Thorens - his birthplace and childhood home.

Wednesday: Tour and celebrate Mass at the Basilica & Monastery of the Visitation. Tour of Annecy Walking in the Footsteps of St. Francis de Sales visiting churches & homes from DeSales' life, and locations where his miracles occurred.

Thursday: Boat ride across the Lake of Annecy to Talloires, where we will hike up to the Church of St. Germain for Mass, a church often visited by St. Francis de Sales.

Friday: Travel to Lyon, where DeSales died in 1622. There we will tour the town of Lyon, visit the Cathedral, and celebrate Mass.

TO GO BAGS NEEDED!



July is our month to help the Empowerment Center. Help provide a “go-bag” and drop it off in the social hall of the Oratory.

**THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO HOLINESS:
Part two**

The Second Vatican Council

Dogmatic Constitution on the Church: *Lumen Gentium*

“The Universal Call to Holiness” (chapter 5)

“To the eyes of faith, the church is holy, because it has its origin in God who is holy, because it is the bride of Christ who is ‘the Holy One of God,’ and because it is indwelt and given life by the Holy Spirit. By their baptism, all the members of the Church participate in this holiness of God and are called upon to actualize that holiness within their lives: they are to clearly manifest what they already are. Thus, the Christian life is a collaboration with a gift received. This collaboration is accomplished by recognizing that Jesus Christ is the source of the Christian character of the baptized and that it is He who leads the baptized into the full flowering of this Christian character by the gift of His Spirit.”

Francis de Sales' Vision

Francis' vision is totally one with that of the Second Vatican Council and is articulated in practically the same language. Francis writes, “Believe me.....devotion is the delight of delights and the queen of virtues because it is perfection of charity....it alone places us in perfection.” The Council says, “It is charity towards God and neighbor which characterized the true disciple of Christ.”

As title for the third chapter of Part One of his *Introduction*, Francis has: “Devotion is Possible in Every Vocation and Profession.” The Council entitles Chapter 5 of *Lumen Gentium*: “The Universal Call to Holiness in the Church.”

What relationship does holiness have to life in the world and to the history of the human family? Christians are members of the human family and nothing which they experience is foreign to life in the world. Francis writes, “Devotion perfects everything....care of the family is made more peaceful, love of husband and wife mores sincere, service of the prince more faithful, and every other occupation more pleasant and agreeable.” The Council translates the same sentiment for today in these words: “The call to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity is made to all, no matter what their state or walk of life is. By this holiness a more human manner of life is also fostered in earthly society.”

The teaching of Francis de Sales is rooted in the tradition begun with Christ and his apostles. His teaching has in fact been broadly recognized and integrated into the Church's teaching for almost four centuries. Pope Paul VI who led the council to its conclusion articulated it again for our age at the Second Vatican Council.
